<u>OMEGLE</u>

It has come to the attention of the Local Authority that there are significant safeguarding concerns in respect of the Omegle.com website/app due to its harmful sexual content and access to personal data including locations. Children, young people and their parents/carers are advised to delete this app.

If a child/young person has been a victim of online harm/exploitation then they should report this to 101 and where required appropriate safeguarding referrals should be made. If it is believed a child is at immediate risk then emergency services should be contacted by ringing 999.

What to do if a child has an

Actions to take if a child has an asthma attack and when to call 999.

TACK

Help them to sit up - don't let them lie down. Try to keep them calm.

Help them take one puff of their reliever inhaler (with their spacer, if they have it) every 30 to 60 seconds, up to a total of 10 puffs.

If they don't have their reliever inhaler, or it's not helping, or if you are worried at any time, call 999 for an ambulance.

If the ambulance has not arrived after 10 minutes and their symptoms are not improving, repeat step 2.

If their symptoms are no better after repeating step 2, and the ambulance has still not arrived, contact 999 again immediately.

Important: This asthma attack advice does not apply to MART inhalers. Speak to your GP or asthma nurse for more information.



Young People and Vaping

Please find enclosed information regarding the increasing trend of young people engaging in vaping. Figures from the School Health Research Network Student Health and Wellbeing Survey show that 20% of young people from Year 7 to Year 11 say they've tried vaping, with 5% of secondary school pupils in Wales vaping at least once a week. A recent Public Health Wales snapshot survey of pupils in year 7 and 10 from a small sample of Welsh secondary schools found the proportion of year 10 pupils using vapes every day is around nine per cent. Among these daily vapers around two thirds showed signs of moderate or high dependency to nicotine using a validated measure.

At Cowbridge School, advice regarding the dangers of vaping is regularly included in assemblies. The wider curriculum also contains education and information for young people.

We have recently informed the police of illicit vapes being sold to young people in the community. These are of particular concern since these illicit products are often sold in informal, unregulated marketplaces (including via social media) and in small retailers, diminishing the regulations put in place to protect children and young people from the potential harms of vaping. Please could all parents be vigilant and refer your concerns to the relevant organisation contained within this important Public Health Wales Guidance.

Vaping is banned across the school premises and where young people are caught vaping, especially indoors where it is likely to trigger a whole school Fire evacuation, serious consequences will apply and this could involve Fixed-term exclusion from Cowbridge School.

•Send your child to school on time.

- Ring/Text school early and daily if your child can not attend.
- Avoid holidays in term time.
- Keep school informed of your updated contact number.

We will.....

- Keep you regularly informed of your child's attendance.
- Treat any information you give us in a supportive and sensitive way.
- Welcome your child every day.
- Be happy that you have chosen to give your child the opportunity of the best future.

We understand that sometimes getting your children up and out on time every morning can be difficult, particularly if your child doesn't want to go for some reason.

We know that children who miss even small amounts of education can fall behind guickly and can miss out on so much. Being in school and on time increases learning and social opportunities.

If you suspect that your child may be missing school or is unhappy at school, contact the school or the Inclusion Team who can help resolve any difficulties and offer friendly advice.

Make sure your child knows that you do not approve of them missing school for any reason, but be on the alert for any particular reasons for not attending school, like bullying, difficulties with school-work.

Here are some ways you can help.

Take an interest in your child's education, ask them what they did in school and celebrate their successes and listen to their worries.

If you can't help them, speak to the school and let them know of any difficulties.

Make sure you know the school's attendance policy; every school has one.

If your child is away for other reasons like a doctor's appointment or the dentist, let the school know in advance. Please try and book appointments towards the end of the day.

If your child is absent get in touch with school. Staff will work with you to help improve the situation. It's better to contact us first so that we can make sure steps are taken to help you.



Information from the Welsh Government regarding vaccination

Vaccination is one of the most important things we can do to protect children and young people against ill health. The Welsh Government and Public Health Wales have developed the following guide to vaccinations for young people. The <u>guide</u> explains when and how vaccinations are offered to young people in school years 7 to 11 (ages 11 to 16) and why they are so important. Parents and carers are asked to read the guide. In addition, when each vaccination is due you will receive information from the school about the vaccination being offered along with a consent form*. Please also read this information and return the consent form as soon as possible, so that your child receives the best protection they can have against these serious diseases. Thank you.

(*Young people attending secondary schools in the Cardiff and Vale university health board area receive their year 9 vaccinations (3-in-1 and MenACWY) at their GP surgery so will not receive information about these vaccinations from schools in this area.)

Flu – Nasal Spray Flu Vaccine will be offered in school from Reception to Year 11

Anyone can get flu but children have the highest rate of infection and it can be serious for them. The vaccine can help protect your child against serious complications from flu, such as pneumonia and help protect others who may be vulnerable to complications from flu. The nasal flu spray is the best way to protect against flu and reduce the spread of the seasonal influenza virus.

HPV – The HPV vaccine will be offered to girls and boys in Secondary School from Year 8

HPV infection is very common. There is clear evidence that the HPV vaccination can reduce your child's chances of developing HPV-related cancers and HPV-related genital warts. In time, it is expected the HPV vaccine will save hundreds of lives every year in the UK by preventing cancers caused by HPV. If your child missed their HPV vaccine in school, please contact the School Nursing Immunisation Team on 02920 907661/664 or email <u>immunisation.Cavuhbschoolnursing@wales.nhs.uk</u> to discuss and/or book a catch-up clinic

It is vital that your child receives key routine scheduled vaccinations throughout their childhood and on time - please ensure these are up to date as they grow up. Your GP practice should invite your child to receive the following vaccines however please note that if your child attends a Cardiff and Vale school but lives outside the area, you will need to contact the GP to make an appointment.

Pre Schoolers (offered from 3 years and 4 months of age)

MMR vaccine (2nd dose) protects against measles, mumps and rubella
4-in-1 vaccine (booster) which protects against diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis and polio
Between 13-15 years
3-in-1 teenage booster (Td/IPV) which protects against diphtheria, tetanus and polio
MenACWY which protects against Meningitis and Septicaemia.

If you are unsure, or think your child has missed any of these vaccinations, contact Child Health on 02921 836928 or your GP surgery and ask if they can check your vaccination record.

It is best to have vaccinations on time, but it is never too late to catch up on missed vaccinations. Vaccinations saves Lives
