
#### **School Council meeting minutes 6th July 2023**

## YCA Climate Refugee petition

## What is the YCA?

Established in 2020, the YCA is a democratic and youthled initiative supported by Size of Wales and the Welsh Centre for International Affairs (WCIA). It consists of 15 youth members across Wales who campaign for climate justice in Wales and across the world. The petition will launch on July the 6th on the UK government's website!

According to the <u>UN</u>, unless serious climate action is taken across the World, by 2050, 200 million people will require humanitarian assistance annually due to disasters brought on by climate change.

### What are Climate refugees?

The YCA defines climate refugees as:

'people who have been forcibly displaced due to impacts on their livelihood generated by climate change. These impacts could include, but are not limited to, the adverse effects of extreme weather events and weather-related disasters, sealevel rising, food and water insecurity, climate-related natural disasters, climate-induced increased resource competition, desertification, land degradation, drought, and any other climate-induced factor that makes a person's current way of life and place of living infeasible and uninhabitable

## What is the petition about?

It is estimated over 20 million people are displaced per annum due to climate change, yet climate refugees are not recognised anywhere. Therefore, the YCA is launching a petition to the UK government to recognise Climate Refugees under UK Law. This would entitle the above group of people to protection under the UK Asylum Bill, alongside equal respect, privileges, and rights to those who are currently able to obtain Refugee status under the jurisdiction of the Home Office of the UK Government.
